VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

First Vice President, John Ebeling read the Executive Board report as follows:

EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

The March 4, 2010 meeting of the St. Louis Labor Council, AFL-CIO Executive Board was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by President Robert Soutier.

A roll call of officers disclosed the following: **Present:** Robert Soutier, John Ebeling, (Gary Otten for Joseph Barrett), Nancy Cross, Jim Dougherty, Tony Ellebracht, Edward Fleming, Jr., Tom George, Chico Humes, Earline Jones, Kevin McNatt, Tony Rippetto, Gary Smith, John Stiffler, Patrick White and David Zimmermann.

Excused and recorded as present: Mary Armstrong, Gerald Feldhaus, Don Giljum, Mike Goebel, Pat Kellett, Gordon King, Tom McNeil, Perri Pryor, Gary Reay, Joe Schonlau, Mark Staffne, Vincent Todt, and Mark Woolbright.

Also present were Ed Finkelstein, Labor Tribune; Marcia Cline and Roz Sherman Voellinger United Way and Karen Lyons, Labor Council.

President Soutier asked Ed Finkelstein to give a brief overview of the upcoming Labor Seder.

Ed explained that the Seder celebrates the Jewish holiday of Passover, and that Passover commemorates the Exodus and the freedom of the Israelites from ancient Egypt where they were enslaved under the Pharaoh. The second Labor Seder luncheon will be held on Thursday, May 6, 2010 at the Jewish Federation-Kopolow Building at 12 Millstone Campus Drive. Our Board meeting will commence at 9:00 a.m. followed by a tour of the Holocaust Museum at 10:00 a.m. There will then be a "critical issues" discussion at 11:00 a.m., the Seder luncheon at 12:00 p.m. and the program will conclude at 1:30 p.m. It was discussed that invitations will be sent in the mail to remind everyone of this event.

President Soutier reminded the Board of the upcoming Union Labor Mass to be held on Sunday, May 2, 2010 at the Shrine of St. Joseph at 11th and Biddle in St. Louis. This mass is a non-denominational service which is held in commemoration of our union brothers and sisters who have passed away in the past year. It is a time for us to come together as a labor family and honor the lives of these men and women. After the mass, there is a delicious brunch held at Maggie O'Brien's Restaurant.

Soutier mentioned that Bob Kortkamp works very hard on putting this event together each year and encouraged everyone to participate. More information can be obtained by calling the Labor Council office.

President Soutier spoke about the \$5 for the Fight campaign and asked if the Board thought it would be a good idea to get some "employers" involved in donating to the fund. Soutier said that though the economy contributed to this situation, some employers may be willing to help their former employees by contributing to this fund.

The matter was discussed and a motion was made, seconded and passed to compose a letter to be sent to the various unions for them to send out to their employers to solicit donations for the \$5 for the Fight Fund.

Marcia Cline gave a short report on the \$5 for the Fight fund and said that since January 1, 2010, 96 people have been helped. Marcia reported on the severity of the problem with so many people being out of work and virtually no hope in sight for quite a while; people are becoming distraught. She said that the United Way is trying to put together a program to help some of these people with problems such as alcoholism, gambling, stress and the like. This program would be in addition to the Union Counseling Course soon to be provided in April.

President Soutier asked Karen Lyons to report on the Kids Against Hunger union food packaging session. Kids Against Hunger is a program whereby volunteers help to package one-pack meals to help feed the hungry here in the states where the need arises and in devastated areas around the world.

Karen Lyons reported that she had contacted the Kids Against Hunger program manager, MiMi Elliott and had made arrangements with her for the union members to come out and assist with packing the food on one of two Saturdays. The dates to choose from were Saturday, April 24, 2010 or Saturday, May 22, 2010; and the time choices were 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. or 12:30 p.m. to 1:30 p.m. It was discussed, and a motion was made, seconded and passed to approve the date of Saturday, April 24, 2010 and the time slot of 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. to help with the food packaging. It was decided that the members would let Karen know by April 1, 2010 how many additional people they would be bringing along to help, as they would like to have approximately 60-100 people to make up 3-5 assembly lines.

Karen also asked the Board if they would like to proceed with plans for this year's Andy Owens/Robert J. Kelley event. It was suggested that instead of a dinner, this year we would do a cocktail party with a "Luau" theme. The possibility of using either Norwood Hills Country Club or Glen Echo Country Club was discussed. It was decided to use Norwood Hills, as the parking arrangements there were more accommodating. It was discussed and decided to try to obtain a date early in August to have the award's night function to be held outside on a patio setting. Karen said that she would proceed with making the plans for the event.

A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the recommendations as read.

Jim Dougherty, President UFCW, Local #655 asked for a copy of the Labor Club rules. It was decided by the Board that each member would receive a copy of said rules for their clarification.

Nancy Cross, Vice President SEIU, Local #1 passed out flyers from MO Jobs With Justice regarding the "Repeal the Earnings Tax" petition that is being circulated. This petition would put a statewide initiative on the November 2010 ballot that would enable the elimination of St. Louis and Kansas City's City 1% earnings tax by making it subject to votes by those communities in April 2011. It will also ban the creation of any new earnings taxes in the state.

It was noted that we need members to donate time to gather names help keep this off the ballot in November.

Marcia Cline reminded the members of the Union Counseling Course held all four Thursdays in April at the IBEW, Local #1 Industry Training Center, and said that it will give their members valuable information to be able to help other members.

John Ebeling, CWA, Local #6300 reported on the Whirlpool rally in Evansville, Indiana and said that it was a huge success. He said there were approximately 5,500 people involved and gave accolades to Randy Kiser, Hugh McVey, and Richard Trumpka for putting this together.

Gary Otten, (representing Joseph Barrett) Painters District Council #2 offered Cardinal baseball tickets for giveaways as incentives to gain \$5 for the Fight donations.

Bob Soutier also offered 4 box seats for the cause.

President Soutier mentioned the memorial charity boxing event in memory of Jim Hathman to be held at the Plumbers and Pipefitters, Local #562 Hall on Friday, May 7, 2010 and encouraged everyone to participate.

With nothing further to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.

A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the minutes as read.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Soutier spoke regarding "Kids Against Hunger," an organization that brings packaged, nutritious meals to hungry children all over the world. He said that the Executive Board has decided to volunteer their time and help package on Saturday, April 24, 2010. If anyone would like to join them or needs more information regarding this please call the Council office.

Soutier said there will be a meeting of the Executive Board and all Labor Clubs on April 21, 2010 at GCC/IBT, Local #6-505M. This meeting will be a review of all rules and regulations of the Labor Clubs to make sure that everyone is on the same page when it comes to interviewing candidates.

President Soutier reminded the delegates of the Union Counseling Course put on by the United Way in conjunction with the Labor Council to be held on April 8, 15, 22, and 29 at the IBEW, Local #1 Training Center. He said that Marcia Cline and Roz Sherman Voellinger have put a lot of work into forming these classes and to please try to assign someone from your staff to attend these meetings. Soutier said that these classes will contain valuable information which will be of great help to our out of work members.

Soutier reminded the group of the April 6th Election and said that the Labor vote on the Metro issue was crucial. Without getting this passed, the Transit Union will take a major hit, as well as SEIU and the Construction Trades. He said that passage would definitely create jobs.

President Soutier informed the delegates that the Stagehands, Musicians and members of AFTRA unions of St. Louis would be picketing the J. Scheidegger Theatre at Lindenwood University in St. Charles, on Wednesday, March 17, 2010. The producer's of the PBS show they were filming had not signed any agreements with the AFM and were bringing in non-union instrumentalists, video, and other crews from outside the region. Soutier asked for support for these unions.

President Soutier asked the delegation for support and participation in this year's annual Union Labor Mass to be held on Sunday, May 2, 2010 at the Shrine of St. Joseph in St. Louis. He explained that this is a non-denominational service at which we honor the lives of our union brothers and sisters who have passed away in the last year. At 8:30 a.m. there will be a prayer service outside the church at the memorial site for anyone

who has died specifically from a job related accident or illness, followed by the 9:00 mass. At the conclusion of the mass, a police escort will lead the congregation to a brunch at Maggie O'Brien's Restaurant. Information can be obtained by calling the Labor Council office.

President Soutier again asked for donations to the \$5 for the Fight Fund which assists out of work union members with help in paying their house or rent payments, utility bills, medical costs and living expenses Soutier explained that the fund had helped several hundred families in the past two years, but is running dangerously low.

Soutier said that our members have been doing their part by donating to the \$5 for the Fight Fund and now maybe it was time to ask some of the "employers" to lend a helping hand. President Soutier said that he would compose a letter to be sent to the unions to use as a "sample letter" to send out to some of their employers to solicit donations from them for the fund. He said that the very people who used to employ these now out-of-work members may have enough heart to donate to their cause.

President Soutier spoke about the press conference held at St. Louis City Hall in an effort to mount opposition to a ballot initiative that would end the city's earning's tax. Wealthy investor Rex Sinquefield wants to eliminate the city's earnings tax as well as the state's income tax. Soutier spoke of the dangerous effects this would have on our city if passed, and that this is only training ground for him to bring "right to work" to the ballot in the future.

President Soutier then read the COPE report as follows:

Dave Meinell, President of the Missouri ARA announced that Ranken Technical College was in need of old computer equipment. The students clean and restore the equipment and pass them on to city and county schools in need. He said that the ARA would gladly pick up and deliver any items you may want to donate if you would just call the Labor Council office.

Chris Molitor of IAFF, Local #73 spoke out warning the delegates against signing any petitions regarding the city's earnings tax.

Randy Kiser, AFL-CIO thanked the delegates for their support of the Whirlpool rally they held in Evansville, Indiana trying to save union jobs.

Clem Smith, IAM took the microphone to announce his candidacy for State Rep in District #71. He was an IAM member working for Chrysler Corporation for 13 years and also a member of CBTU. He asked for the support of the delegation.

Lew Moye, President St. Louis Chapter CBTU, thanked the Labor Council and their affiliates for their support in the special election in District #57, and thanked everyone for their support of the Whirlpool rally. He also spoke of a federal grant to be received by the city of St. Louis from the Department of Labor to help support "green" job training.

Tom Sansevere, IBEW, Local #1 reminded everyone to check with their labor clubs to volunteer for lit drops for the April elections.

Tony Pecinovsky, St. Louis Newspaper Guild announced the Herschel Walker Award Breakfast to be held on Saturday, May 8. The price is \$20 in advance and \$25 at the door.

Yvette Goods, IBEW, Local #1, spoke briefly on the grant mentioned by Lew Moye, regarding "green jobs."

GOOD AND WELFARE

President Soutier spoke briefly of the healthcare issue and how some Canadian born people he had recently met can't figure out what all the fuss is about in the US; their government run health program is wonderful.

President Soutier mentioned what a great job he thought Michael Kelley of The Kelley Group was doing on KMOX radio and said to catch him on *Crossfire* at 7:00 p.m. Thursday.

Mike Louis, Local #777 said that the Aldermanic Board of St. Louis gave the Mayor the authority to appoint a Labor negotiator and wondered if Bob Soutier had been contacted by the Mayor for guidance on choosing the negotiator.

Soutier remarked that he had not been contacted by the Mayor.

Lew Moye followed up with a glowing affirmation of the character of Clem Smith, 71st District democratic candidate for State Representative.
