The February 10, 2011 meeting of the St. Louis Labor Council, AFL-CIO Executive Board was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by President Robert Soutier.

Also present were Mayor Francis Slay, City of St. Louis; Mary Ellen Ponder, Mayor's Office; Ed Finkelstein, Labor Tribune; Marcia Cline, United Way; and Karen Lyons, St. Louis Labor Council.

President Soutier introduced Mayor Slay who spoke regarding Proposition "E".

Mayor Slay asked for the endorsement of the St. Louis Labor Council in support of Proposition E, which states, "Should the city continue to have an earnings tax?" The Mayor spoke extensively on the effects on the city if this proposition fails. He explained that the earnings tax is a minimal 1% tax, which most employees and employers do not think is too high and most also think we need. The failure to pass will negatively impact the services in the city such as fire protection and police protection, greatly affecting public safety. Mayor Slay explained that it would be very difficult to try to make up the earnings tax. One alternative would be an approximate raise in sales tax of 5%, making the sales tax in the city a whopping 14%! The Mayor said that all that is needed is a simple majority. He asked for the Labor Council's endorsement and stated that he needs help with phone banking, door knocking, and getting our members out to vote. If we do not vote – this proposition will fail! It is extremely important to our City that we get out and vote YES to Proposition E on April 5<sup>th</sup>.

A motion was made, seconded and approved to endorse Proposition "E".

President Soutier invited Mary Ellen Ponder to attend the Tuesday, February 15<sup>th</sup> Delegate meeting to explain the importance of voting for Proposition "E".

A moment of silence was held for Bob Kortkamp, our dear friend and Secretary Treasurer Emeritus of the St. Louis Labor Council, who passed away on January 20<sup>th</sup>.

President Soutier let the members know that tickets to the union Mardi Gras tent were now available and asked that if anyone was interested to contact the Council office.

President Soutier announced that Dan Carico of Mixed Martial Arts would like to put on another exhibition fight with a portion of his earnings to be donated to the \$5 for the Fight Fund.

A motion was made, seconded and approved to support this endeavor.

Joe Steiger, FOP spoke on the issue of local control of the City's police department. He said that the plan they have seen thus far would allow the city to make changes at will, and the Department would not have any say in the matter. The plan includes control of all benefits, pensions, vacations, pay schedules, holidays, etc. The main issues are that they have no binding arbitration, loss of pension control, and no collective bargaining. They would like to have some assurance of their benefits. A motion was made, seconded and approved that the Council supports the State of Missouri to maintain control of the City of St. Louis Police Department.

Don Giljum, Business Manager, Operating Engineers, Local #148 will retire as of May 1, 2011. Don introduced Keith Linderer to the Board as his replacement as Acting Business Manager as of Feb. 1, 2011, and his replacement on the Board.

President Soutier remarked that since Tony Ellebracht is no longer with Communication Workers, he will be replaced on the Board by Mike Mehringer, President CWA, Local #6300.

President Soutier called both Keith Linderer and Mike Mehringer to the front of the room and gave them the oath of office to become vice presidents to the St. Louis Labor Council Executive Board. A round of applause welcomed them both as new members.

President Soutier told the Board that he would be giving an updated report on the Defined Benefit Pension Plan, since changes will occur due to the recent death of Bob Kortkamp. Soutier also said that the Council would now be using Keith Kowalczyk at Ekon Benefits instead of Milliman for their actuarial services at approximately half the cost.

President Soutier informed the group of the efforts of the St. Louis Label & Service Trades Council to promote solidarity by using their labels on each check that leaves your office. The labels attach directly to the check and read: "This Payment Made Possible by Union Wages." You can contact Craig Darrah at the Label & Service Trades Council, or the Labor Council office to purchase. The cost for 500 label cards is \$25.

Vince Todt, President of Elevator Constructors, Local #3 announced his retirement effective in March, 2011. Vince will be missed and is wished well in his new endeavors.

A motion was made to vote “Yes” in support of Proposition “S” an \$11 bond issue in the City of Ferguson for public safety enhancements including the construction of a new Fire House #1 and renovations and addition to the Ferguson Police Department. The motion was seconded, and approved.

Mike Mehringer, President CWA, Local #6300 asked for the Board’s support against HB 339 and SB 209, which changes the laws regarding telecommunications as they relate to the carrier of last resort obligations. A motion was made, seconded and approved to vote against these bills.

A discussion ensued regarding the hard work the labor clubs put into the recommendations. It was agreed that the Board should take this into consideration and rely on their interview process of each candidate.

A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept all COPE recommendations as read.

Chico Humes, President GCC/IBT, Local 6505M, complimented Don Giljum on all his hard work on the Single Payer issue.

Jeff Aboussie gave a report on Senate Bill 1 regarding the Right to Work issue. He said that the messaging and facts presented at the meeting he attended in Jefferson City were incorrect, and that we need to take advantage of that. He mentioned that we need a total transcript and fact check to get this information corrected and put onto our websites.

President Soutier announced again that the Right to Work meetings are now held on the fourth Monday of each month at 9:00 a.m. at the Painter’s Hall. He said that this month’s meeting is February 28 and that the March 28<sup>th</sup> meeting would still be scheduled even though several members would not be in attendance due to the Missouri State Council of Machinists’ convention in Jefferson City.

Ed Finkelstein, Labor Tribune said that he will soon be launching a new program for the \$5 for the Fight Fund which would incorporate several levels of contribution possibilities.

With nothing further to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.
